ERIC Documents on the Teaching of Foreign Languages: List Number 1 Language Laboratories

This is a list of those documents related to the language lab which may be obtained in microfiche or hard copy from the ERIC (Educational Resources Information Center) Document Reproduction Service. The list was compiled by means of a close search of computer-generated catalogues of comprehensive ERIC assessions which have been fully processed into the system by the U. S. Office of Education, the MLA/ERIC and CAL/ERIC Clearinghouses, and other ERIC Clearinghouses since November 1966 and through June 1968. Attention is called to the fact that a significant number of ERIC documents having primary interest in other fields (e.g. psychology, administration, linguistics, etc.) also have some relevance to foreign language teaching but are not included here. Supplements to this list will be compiled periodically.

This is not a classified bibliography; entries have been listed only in alphabetical order. However, a USER INDEX is provided below which will help the reader identify documents on twelve special topics. (Since all documents accessioned into the ERIC system are subjected to a coordinate indexing procedure and in each case bibliographical information, abstract, and idexing terms are stored on magnetic tape, eventually computer-generated bibliographies on special topics will be a reality.). Purchase data for each document appears in brackets. "MF" means microfiche; "HC" means hard copy. Information on ordering ERIC documents will be found at the end of this list.

The number of pages is given for separate reports, curriculum guides, surveys, etc., but not for ERIC documents which appeared originally in professional journals or newsletters. To compute the number of pages in the latter items divide the hard copy (HC) price by 4 and subtract 2 (e.g. HC price of \$0.36 means the article consists of seven pages).

HOW TO LOCATE AN ABSTRACT

The concluding information (after the purchase data in brackets) refers the reader to the place where he can examine an abstract of any document (e.g. RR 74n RIE (Mar 1967) 21; FLA (Oct 1967) 76):

RR Office of Education Research Reports, 1956-65, June 1967. Published in 2 volumes: Resumés (OE-12039), \$1.75; and Indexes (OE-12028), \$2.00. Order from Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C. 20402. (All RR page references are to the Resumés volume.) Known as the "Historical Collection," RR lists research reports produced from 1956 to 1965 as a result of U. S. Office of Education contracts and grants.

RIE Research in Education, November 1966—. RIE is a monthly abstract catalogue of reports, studies, articles, etc. which have been processed into the ERIC system since 1965. Order from Superintendent of Documents, U. S. Printing Office, Washington, D. C. 20402 (subscription per year: domestic, \$11.00; foreign, \$13.75; single issue, \$1.00). FLA Foreign Language Annals, October 1967—. FLA is the quarterly journal of the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages, 62 Fifth Ave., New York, N. Y. 10011 (subscription per year: Individual, \$4.00; foreign, \$4.50; libraries, \$8.00; single issue, \$2.00). Each issue carries a department contributed by the ERIC Clearinghouse on the Teaching of Foreign Languages which includes selected recent abstracts from RIE. References to FLA give month and year of issue and page number.
