The annual subscription rate is \$6.00 to individuals, \$4.00 to students and \$10.00 to libraries and other institutions. Prices for individual copies or back issues are available on request.

Persons wishing to submit papers should note the following: papers should not exceed 20 typed, double-spaced pages, although longer papers will be considered. Contributors should submit a clear, error-free, manuscript (three copies preferred) in the style suggested by The MLA Style Sheet, second edition. AUSLEGUNG subscribes to a blind review policy; the author's name and academic institution should appear only on a detachable cover sheet. Whenever possible, AUSLEGUNG furnishes to contributors copies of the referees' comments.

Book reviews and review articles may be written on books listed in the "Books Received" column. Books not listed in the column may be reviewed if the editor is notified and gives approval in advance. Any individual who wishes to review a book should inform the editor of the book(s) he or she wishes to review. Books will be sent on a first-come first-served basis. Reviews and articles should be sent to AUSLEGUNG within three months after receipt of the book. All correspondence should be sent to the editors in care of AUSLEGUNG, Department of Philosophy, University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas 66045. Manuscripts cannot be returned unless accompanied by return postage.
