The Independent Journal of Philosophy, in cooperation with Howard University, announces a three-day international symposium on the topic of Modernity, to be held, under the sponsorship of the Liberty Fund, on 27-30 May 1980 in the Washington, D.C. area. Papers are welcomed, which, from a systematic, critical-historical perspective, offer a philosophical diagnosis of and response to the question of Modernity, particularly as it arises in the context of the related issues of 'human nature' and 'freedom'.

Symposium participants will receive honoraria of up to \$1000 for their papers and their participation, and reimbursement for the costs of travel, lodging and food. It is anticipated that papers selected for the symposium will be published by The Independent Journal of Philosophy. Alternately, an honorarium of up to \$500 will go to authors of papers selected for publication, but not also accepted for the symposium.
