Call for Papers

The Charles S. Peirce Sesquicentennial International Congress will be held at Harvard University the week preceding 10 September 1989 (the one-hundred-fiftieth anniversary of Peirce's birth). The Congress Organizing Committee hereby issues a call for papers on any aspect of Peirce's work, in any of the several fields in which he conducted research (science, mathematics, philosophy, history of science, logic, phenomenology, cosmology, semeiotic). The theme of the Congress is Peirce and Contemporary Thought. Works that address some aspect of this topic, particularly those that continue some topic within Peirce's research interests, are especially sought. Presentations must be limited to a maximum of 30 minutes (including both reading and discussion).

Send three copies of a 200-word abstract (two copies without name), typed double spaced, along with current mailing address to: K.L. The program committee will select papers according to a blind review process.
