The annual subscription rate is \$8.00 to individuals, \$6.00 to students and \$10.00 to libraries and other institutions. Outside of the U.S. and Canada, the rate is \$10..00 U.S. Prices for individual copies or back issues are available on request.

Persons wishing to submit papers should note the following: papers normally should not exceed 30 typed, double-spaced pages, although longer papers may be considered in some cases. Contributors should submit three clear, error-free, manuscripts in the style suggested by The MLA Style Sheet, second edition. AUSLEGUNG subscribes to a blind review policy; the author's name and academic institution should appear only on a detachable cover sheet. Whenever possible, AUSLEGUNG furnishes copies

of the referees' comments to contributors.

Book reviews and review articles may be written on books listed in the "Books Available" column. Books not listed in the column may be reviewed if the Book Review Editor is notified and gives approval in advance. Any individual who wishes to review a book should inform the Book Review Editor of the book(s) he or she wishes to review. Books will be sent on a first-come first-served basis. Papers should be send to the Editor and book reviews to the Book Review Editor in care of AUSLEGUNG, Department of Philosophy, University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas 66045. In order for manuscripts to be returned to the author they should be submitted along with return postage.

Dear Reader,

With this issue, Auslegung begins its fifteenth year of publication. The journal has become, in the past few years, no longer singly a "graduate journal," though we still publish quite a few articles by graduate students and new faculty members. And we are happy to do so, for this work is often the most connected to the most recent research in various fields. We have been well-served by out blind-review policy, and by the fact that we are simply interested in publishing the best articles that we receive, regardless of the philosophical trend that they represent. The present issue, with its good balance of continental, analytic, and historical perspectives, is a good example. We have also published a number of articles from feminist, Marxist, and other "non-mainstream" perspectives in recent years--and hope to continue to receive such articles.

We have, however, lately become concerned to make sure that the journal is even more open to all trends in philosophy, including non-Western trends. There has never been in the past, to my knowledge, an editorial policy restricting our publication to "Western Philosophy." The problem is that we lack qualified readers who can review articles in Eastern, African, or Latin American traditions (and we see it as a special strength of the journal that we have a very good group of readers, who are competent in the areas that we receive articles in). If you know of someone who is qualified in any of these areas, please have them got in touch with the journal.

The next issue, volume 15, number 2 (Summer 1989), will contain a cumulative index for the entire run of the journal.
