These fully accredited year-long courses in France, Spain and West Germany are open to American high school students for either the 11th or 12th grades, who have good academic records and who will have completed the equivalent of two years of study of French, Spanish or German.

The well-balanced curriculum, including intensive study of language and culture of country in which campus is located, permits 11th grade students to return to their regular schools fully prepared for senior year.

Seniors must be diploma candidates from their own schools as neither diploma nor college counseling are offered. Experienced teaching staffs include Andover, Exeter and/or St. Paul's faculty members as well as qualified native instructors. Students live with native families, travel during vacation periods. Limited scholarships are available.

These courses are joint off-campus activities of Phillips Academy, Andover, Mass.; The Phillips Exeter Academy, Exeter, New Hampshire; and St. Paul's School, Concord, New Hampshire.

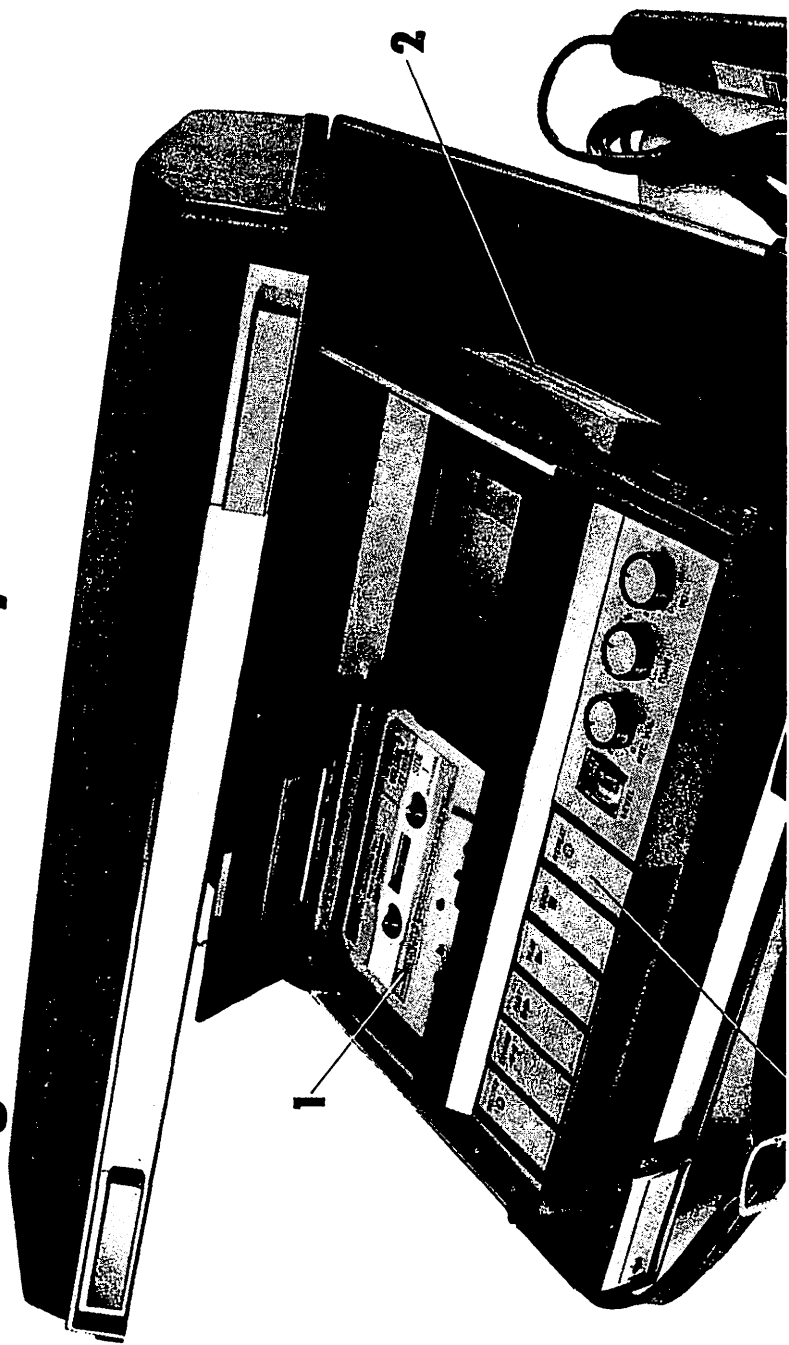

4 While the REPEAT-CORDER L is repeating, the student may record . . . and this too is repeated, so he can compare his accent with the instructor's, his music with the original. He may re-record as often as he wishes, until he is satisfied and presses the PLAY button to continue.
