Nature of the Facility

Distribution of Disciplines over Facilities

Of the various laboratories polled, 56.2 percent are known as language laboratories, modern language laboratories and/or foreign language laboratories and offer facilities to serve either the foreign languages and ESOL or both. The only other units serving these disciplines alone are two of the Language Centers representing 2.25 percent of the total response. Other labs, 22.5 percent of those polled, are also known as language labs, etc., but offer their facilities to serve additional disciplines. All but one of the labs that are known as learning and autotutorial labs, listening centers, etc. serve numerous disciplines: the exception being one which specializes in Biology.

In proportion to their number, the labs in Groups 3 and 4 serve a greater number of disciplines than the labs in Groups 1 and 2: 92.9 percent of the learning labs, autotutorial labs, etc. offer their facilities for numerous disciplines; 31 percent of the language labs and centers serve disciplines other than the foreign languages and ESOL.

Distribution of Technologies over Facilities

Language laboratories equipped only with audiotapes and records are the most frequent type reported and constitute 46.1 percent of the total responses. Although 16.9 percent of all the laboratories use both visuals and video in addition to tapes, only 7.9 percent are known as language laboratories. Language labs appear to dominate the use of either video or visuals; 13.5 percent and 12.4 percent of the total response fit this category. The term "Language Center" does not indicate additional resources here: the Centers in this grouping offer only tapes and records.

In proportion to their number and regardless of their size, the learning labs, listening labs, et.al. offer a greater variety of media resources than the language labs and centers.

Distribution of Person Reported to over Laboratory Leadership by Title and Rank.

Most Chairpersons and Deans (sometimes both at the same time), regardless of sex, are reported to by Directors (and Supervisors) of laboratories. Laboratory Administrators/Managers are the only lab heads that do not report to a Chairperson. Women tend to report to women: 41.7 percent of the female Deans and/or Chairpersons are over female directed laboratories. Most laboratory leadership on academic lines (including the CUNY College Laboratory Technician, the administrative employee on the Instructional Staff) report to Chairpersons. The few "high managerial" laboratory appointments report to Deans and to a Vice-President while middle-low managers report almost equally to Deans and Chairpersons. The columns in Table A-6 below represent the laboratory leadership by rank by the person reported to: i.e. two Professors report to Deans and three to Chairpersons.
