University of Virginia Arts and Sciences Media Center

The School of Arts and Sciences of the University of Virginia invites applications for the position of Director of the Media Center, a 12 month administrative faculty appointment.

The Director's responsibilities include management of a language laboratory; oversight of several technology-equipped classrooms, including a networked 17 workstation classroom designed for language instruction; and, in collaboration with faculty members and graduate teaching assistants, the design, development, and delivery of multimedia and computer-

based instructional aids. The Director will also research and evaluate third-party products, and will participate in school and university-wide analysis and recommendation of classroom technology tools, including both hardware configurations and software needs. The Director supervises 2 classified staff members and 15-18 student assistants. The Director may teach in the department of the College appropriate to his or her area of expertise.

Competitive applicants will possess a Masters or Doctoral degree in foreign language, education, or a related field; teaching experience at the college level; demonstrated administrative and supervisory ability; strong oral and written communication skills including effective communications with students, staff, and faculty at all levels; and the ability to research and develop new uses for the language lab and technology-equipped classrooms in response to technological innovation, new pedagogical trends, and institutional and faculty goals and initiatives.

Applications should be submitted immediately. Application review will begin January 1, 1996, and the position will remain open until filled, with an expected appointment effective July 1, 1996. Salary is competitive, commensurate with experience. The University of California at Berkeley seeks a Director for the Berkeley Language Media Center. This person must have a broad vision of the goals and methods of language pedagogy and the integration of technology into foreign language learning as well as strong managerial and administrative skills.

The Language Media Center Director is responsible for the acquisition, development and delivery of state-of-the-art language learning materials on the Berkeley campus. Working with a professional staff of 8, the Director: educates faculty, staff, and students in the use of language learning technology; consults with faculty in language, literature, and culture to determine their needs and goals; coordinates technology-based materials development and delivery with other relevant campus units; obtains internal and external funding to expand and diversify the LMC's activities and facilities.

The Director of the LMC reports to the faculty Director of the Berkeley Language Center, Dr. Claire Kramsch. He/She provides involved, hands-on management of the BLC and has overall administrative and managerial responsibility for the BLC programs, activities and resources. The BLC is a central forum for teaching and research related to second language acquisition, professional development of language instruction, and the use of technology in foreign language education. The LMC Director also holds the title of Associate Director of the BLC and, if qualified, has adjunct faculty status.

Qualifications: Strong management, administrative and communication skills; extensive and in-depth knowledge of language learning technology and its integration into modern language pedagogy; experience in working with media relevant to language learning/teaching; experience conducting grant-funded projects; language teaching experience and competence in a language other than English; Ph.D. or equivalent degree in relevant field preferred; equivalent combination of education and experience with language learning media considered. Record of professional activity, including publications, presentations, workshops, materials development, and other professional leadership required. Salary range: \$43,400 to \$65,100.

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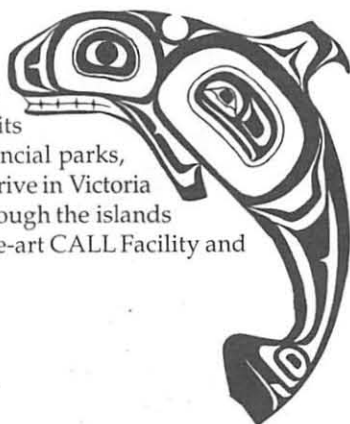
