Membership in the SGAS is open to all persons and organizations interested in German-American studies.

The SGAS has been organized for the following purposes:

1. *To engage in and promote interest in the study of history, linguistics, folklore, genealogy, literature, theatre, music, and creative art forms as they apply to the cross-cultural relations between German-speaking lands and the Americas;*

2. *To publish, produce, and present research findings and educational materials of the same as a public service;*

3. *To assist researchers, teachers, and students;*

4. *To improve cross-cultural relations.*

All members have voting rights and elect the officers and trustees of the SGAS. The SGAS has been incorporated as a non-profit corporation in the State of Ohio. It is regulated by its By-Laws which are voted on by the membership.

In addition to financing the administrative operations of the Society, membership dues provide each member with a subscription to the *Journal of German-American Studies* and the various annual issues of the *Bulletin of the Society for German-American Studies*. Among the ongoing projects supported by SGAS funds are the publications of the annual Bibliography Americana Germanica and the sponsoring of the annual German-American Studies Symposium which brings together scholars from all parts of the world who present papers on new facets of research in the field of German-American studies. Members receive a current subscription to the *Journal of German-American Studies* and issue of the *SGAS Bulletin*.
