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A Few Württemberg Families
of Grafenberg, Kohlberg, Riederich & Tischardt

This is designed to be a brief and factual account of four Doster families of the United States of America whose American histories have been set forth in *The Doster Genealogy* by Mrs. Ben Hill Doster which was completed, edited and produced by Wadsworth Doster (The William Byrd Press: Richmond, Virginia, 1945). These four families are considered in Chapters XVII, XXII, XXIII, and XXIV of that work and are numbered as Branches 12, 16, 17 and 18.

In some instances the data given here will correct that of *The Doster Genealogy* but the correction is not an intended commentary on that work. Some variation in names will be observed particularly as I have adhered to the spellings given in transcripts of the parish records of Kohlberg, Tischardt, Grafenberg and Riederich.

The histories of each of these families have been traced back only to the middle of the 18th Century but there is every reason to consider that they are of common ancestry. All four families spring from a region of Württemberg which lies in a small triangle of less than five miles to a side between Tischardt, Kappishäusern and Riederich. This region is just northeast of the small city of Metzingen near Reutlingen.

The first family we shall consider, the forebearer of Branch 12, originates in Kohlberg, a small village only a kilometer from Kappishäusern and scarcely two kilometers from either Tischardt or Grafenberg, which villages lie themselves only two kilometers apart. Either Kohlberg or Grafenberg was probably the original seat of the entire family.

The second family, the forebearer of Branch 16, is from Riederich but originates in Kappishäusern and is therefore probably very closely allied to the Kohlberg family. Also in the female line this family is descended from a family of Grafenberg of Branch 17.

The third family, the forebearer of Branch 17, originates in Grafenberg whence the family emigrated to America with such other old Grafenberg families as Brandstetter, Euchner, Roller and Thüringer.

The fourth family we shall consider, the forebearer of Branch 18, originates also in Grafenberg and in the female line has common ancestry with Branch 17. This family has four Doster lines of descent from families of the villages of Grafenberg and Kohlberg.

Note: *The Doster Genealogy*, page 242, has a number of obvious errors, if we accept as fact the above transcript of Grafenberg records. It is evident that only three sons of Johannes and Margaretha (Geiger) Doster reached manhood. *The Doster Genealogy* gives them two sisters, Marguerite and Barbara, who married respectively Fred and George Fisher. I have not enough evidence to solve this riddle but would suggest that Marguerite may well be Margareta Doster (* 23.9.1821), the daughter of Dorothea (Doster) Brudi — see 3. above. Concerning the identity of Barbara, the records in hand give no suggestion.

The Doster Genealogy account of the Brudi family, page 244, also presents us with differences in number and names of children. If our record from Tischartd is complete, then Dorothea Doster and Johann Martin Brudi had only four children which did not include twins: Johann Jakob Brudi and Jakob Johann Brudi. Children Nos. 1., 3., 5. & 8. (page 244 — *The Doster Genealogy*) are the only ones given in the record and the birth dates for three of them are correct or nearly so. The three children not accounted for may have been cousins or possibly did not exist. As they did not come to America their records are vague and probably based upon hearsay. The Margarete Brudi * ca. 1824, who died in adjacent Riederich, may well be the half sister, Margareta Doster, * Grafenberg 23.9.1821 who did marry in Riederich. The records, however, seem to indicate that she never lived in Tischartd with the Brudi family but rather remained with her grandparents in Grafenberg.

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
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In memoriam Peter M. Lindt

Am 20. November 1976 verstarb in New York Peter Max (imilian) Lindt, Präsident der 1870 von Carl Schurz und Dr. Abraham Jacobl gegründeten Social Scientific Society for Intercultural Relations, Inc. Dreißig Jahre lang — seit 1946 — hatte Peter Lindt als unermüdlicher Initiator neuer Projekte und Pläne in entscheidender Weise das Konzept wie den Auftrag des ältesten und angesehensten deutsch-amerikanischen Kultur-Forums in New York geprägt.

Der gebürtige Wiener (26. April 1908) kam am 21. Dezember 1938 mit seiner Frau Theodora, geb. von Stojanovic, nach einem Zwischenaufenthalt in der Schweiz in die Vereinigten Staaten. Er hatte zuvor — und zwar im Jahre 1932 — an der Universität Wien den Doktorgrad der Philosophischen Fakultät (in deutscher Literatur) erworben; zehn Jahre danach, 1942, promovierte er erneut an der New Yorker Columbia University im Fach Germanistik zum Ph.D.

Von 1942 bis 1944 war er politischer — wie literarischer — Kommentator beim Radiosender WBNX in New York, der während dieser Jahre jeden Mittwochnachmittag Peter Lindts viel beachtete Interviews mit führenden Persönlichkeiten der deutschen Emigration ausstrahlte. 1944 erschienen diese Interviews unter dem Titel *Schriftsteller im Exil* in Buchform, drei Jahrzehnte später wurden sie bei Kraus Reprint in Liechtenstein neuaufgelegt. Der Band gibt einen eindrucksvollen Querschnitt durch die literarische Rundfunkfähigkeit Peter Lindts und läßt so berühmte Namen wie Bert Brecht, Thomas Mann, Hermann Broch, Alfred Döblin, Lion Feuchtwanger, Ivan Goll, Carl Zuckmayer, Erich Maria Remarque, Franz Werfel — um nur einige zu nennen — Revue passieren. Die Sammlung dürfte ihre Bedeutung nicht nur als Katalog der deutschen Emigrationsliteratur, sondern auch als zeitgeschichtliches Dokument schlechthin haben.

1945 rief Peter Lindt — neben seiner Rundfunkfähigkeit gab er die Monatsschrift *Der Weltspiegel* heraus — beim New Yorker Radiosender WEVD als Leiter des German-American Broadcast die *German Literature Hour* ins Leben: es war dies das einzige deutschsprachige Rundfunk-Kulturprogramm in den USA überhaupt. 1969 wurde er von seiner Frau abgelöst, die nach dem Fortschreiten seines Augenleidens die Sendung bis 1975 übernahm.

Peter Lindts Lebenswerk ist mit seiner langjährigen Rundfunkfähigkeit, seinen publizistischen Aktivitäten und der Leitung der Social Scientific Society keineswegs erschöpft: er war — bereits vor 1938 — zudem als Schriftsteller und Bühnenautor hervorgetreten; zu nennen wären Stücke wie *Das Leben spielt Komödie* und *Salzburger Intermezzo*, die im Volkstheater in Wien aufgeführt wurden, sowie *Die Ehe des François Beaupré*, die über die Bretter des Grazer Schauspielhauses ging. Was das umfangreiche Erzählwerk — Kurzgeschichten, Novellen etc. — betrifft, so sei hier nur auf den Band *Künstler und Frauen* hingewiesen, der vom Wiener Zsolnay-Verlag angenommen worden war, unter den fatalen Umständen nach dem sog. Anschluß jedoch nicht mehr in den Druck ging.

In Amerika entstand dann außer den genannten *Schriftstellern im Exil* ein Theaterstück mit dem Titel *To Die Where?* (1941/42), das die erschütternde Irrfahrt des Emigrantenschiffs "St. Louis"

zum Gegenstand hat. Neben Essays, Hörspielen und Kurzgeschichten liegen — last but not least — das Manuskript *Mascha* — eine Korrespondenz mit meiner Katze, ein Buch in 20 Briefen mit Illustrationen von Rafaelo Busoni, vor sowie ein längeres Romanfragment. Den gesamten Nachlaß zu sichten, dürfte eine gewiß nicht unbedeutende Aufgabe sein, die noch beträchtliche Arbeit und Geduld erfordern wird.

Peter Lindt, mit dem die am kulturellen Geschehen interessierte deutschsprachige Gemeinde New Yorks einen ihrer verdienstvollsten Vertreter verloren hat, wird allen (und dazu zähle ich auch mich selbst), die das Vergnügen hatten, seine persönliche Bekanntschaft zu machen, als kultivierter und geistig anregender Zeitgenosse in Erinnerung bleiben, als — wenn ich so sagen darf — ein Aristokrat des Geistes und der Gesinnung, von denen es nur mehr ganz wenige gibt. Sein Werk fortzuführen, eine Aufgabe, die nun in den Händen seiner Witwe und langjährigen Mitarbeiterin liegt, dürfte kein leichtes Unterfangen sein.

INDEX TO CONFIRMANTS OF ST. JOHN'S EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH AT GARFIELD HTS., OHIO FOR THE YEARS 1854-1929.....

In celebration of its 125th anniversary, St. John's in Garfield Heights, a suburb of Cleveland, published a book entitled *Geschichte der Evangelisch Lutherischen St. Johannis-Gemeinde zu Garfield Heights, Ohio, 1854-1929*. Written in both English and German, this slim volume contains an appendix (pp. 86-117) listing names and other data relating to the church's membership. Of considerable interest to the genealogist is the "Record of the Confirmed" for the years 1854 to 1929---a list of nearly 1000 persons, including the following information: Name, birth, death, present name (the married name of women), residence or place of burial, date of confirmation.

Each of the entries is assigned a number. To assist the researcher, the following index had been compiled by surname. Each surname is followed by the number of numbers of persons on the list.

A copy of this volume is in the Ward Collection, Western Reserve Historical Society, Cleveland, Ohio.

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GERMAN-AMERICAN GENEALOGICAL GLEANINGS.....

Plotsk in Bessarabia, South Russia was heavily settled by German-speaking emigrants. The parish registers for this territory were filmed in Berlin, and are at the Genealogical Society (Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints) in Salt Lake City. They date from 1884 to 1903. For records prior to 1884, write to U.S. of America Consul, American Embassy, Dept. of State, Washington, D.C. 20521.

An article on genealogical sources in the Staatliche Bibliothek Regensburg (by G. Urbanek) appeared in BLÄTTER DES BAYRISCHEN LANDESVEREINS FÜR FAMILIENKUNDE, Band XII, Heft 13, 38. Jahrgang (1975).

Records of German apothecaries and pharmacists are an extremely valuable source of genealogical data. Many genealogical and biographical articles appear in the periodical which specializes in German apothecary history, BEITRÄGE ZUR APOTHEKENGESCHICHTE. Volume X (Band X), No. 4 (Heft 4) for 1974 (December issue) treats pharmacists in Leutkirch, Ravensburg, Basel, and Stuttgart. The fifth number (Heft 5) of that volume (June 1975) has an article entitled "Apotheker Ernst Rieker aus Backnang in Amerika."

The Verlag Degener (D 8530 Neustadt/Aisch, West Germany) is the publisher of the important work by Carl Schulz (3000 BERLINER KOLONISTEN UND KOLONISTENSÖHNE 1686-1812) which appeared in 1972 and treats some 3000 colonists and their descendants in Berlin.

Degener Verlag has also advertised for sale several other important genealogical works dealing with names and places in Germany, Austria and Switzerland. Write to Degener for free catalogs of the works available.
