To understand theatre thoroughly requires a wide range of knowledge cutting across the boundaries of several disciplines. Yet its study, particularly in American universities, has traditionally been fragmented among departments of speech and drama, the various national literatures, and the fine arts. The new International Theatre Studies Center is designed to provide opportunities for interdisciplinary study in theatre and drama using foreign languages as research tools. It is a new perspective in humanistic inquiry along the lines of an "area studies" program: the cross-cultural understanding of a universal art.

To complement the more than seventy courses in theatre and drama taught throughout the University, the Center itself each semester offers one or more interdisciplinary seminars staffed by faculty members whose research specialties guarantee broad geographic coverage of the topics. In addition, the Center offers the degree **MASTER OF ARTS IN INTERNATIONAL THEATRE STUDIES**, the course program for which is individually tailored to each student's interests. Para saber el teatro se requiere previamente conocer a fondo muchas otras disciplinas; a pesar de esto, su estudio, especialmente en las universidades norteamericanas, se ha fragmentado en departamentos de Speech and Drama, literaturas nacionales, y bellas artes. El actual Centro Internacional de Estudios Teatrales en la Universidad de Kansas tiene por objeto ofrecer la posibilidad de hacer estudios interdisciplinarios e investigaciones en teatro y drama, no sólo en inglés sino también en otros idiomas. Estos estudios, así considerados, permiten un conocimiento más universal del teatro, por el cruce cultural que se deriva de la integración de áreas afines.

Además de los setenta cursos acerca de teatro y arte escénico que ya existen en la Universidad, el Centro ofrecerá en cada semestre uno o más seminarios interdisciplinarios dirigidos por profesores especializados en diversos tópicos y países. También, el Centro ofrecerá el título de *Master of Arts in International Theatre Studies*, cuyo programa estará organizado de acuerdo con los intereses de cada estudiante.
