

General Information

In this volume we are expanding our work into the area of German-American music. The "Index" is to be published every five years as a regular supplement to the *Yearbook*. We hope that in this way the work in our field can be brought to the attention of a larger audience and that the goals of our Society will become even better known among the people interested in German-Americana.
