



FROM THE EDITORS

In this volume of the *Yearbook* we are pleased to include the two special presentations given at the 1984 Symposium of the Society held in Madison, Wisconsin: the keynote address on Carl Schurz by Hans Trefousse and the reminiscences of former Congressman Henry Reuss of Milwaukee.

Complementing the scholarly articles which reflect the varied research interests in German-Americana, the 1984 *Yearbook* contains a collection of letters which document the experiences of Jewish refugees from Krefeld, West Germany, now living in the United States. These letters were solicited by a high school class in Krefeld in conjunction with the tricentennial activities of their community.

The painstaking efforts of our Bibliographic Committee headed by Stephen Benjamin are reflected in the bibliography of German-Ameri-

cana for 1983 with supplements for 1982.

The Editorial Board has grown considerably in the last year. We felt the expansion of the Board necessary in order to more adequately cover the several disciplines which are represented in German-American studies. We are indebted to our regular members for their assistance in evaluating the many manuscripts. We are also grateful to Hartmut Steinecke, Universität-Gesamthochschule Paderborn; Edward Grier and Haskell Springer, University of Kansas, for sharing their expertise on an ad hoc basis. Due to retirement Albert Schmitt, Brown University, will leave the Editorial Board with this issue. We regret losing the services of Professor Schmitt who has worked untiringly to enhance the quality of the *Yearbook*.

We would like to call your attention to a major revision in the system of documentation in *Yearbook* articles to begin with the 1985 volume. We have adopted the second edition of the *MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers* as the style manual for the *Yearbook*. Instead of endnotes, documentation will be provided by brief parenthetical citations in the text accompanied by a list of works cited at the end of the article. We request the cooperation of our contributors in making this change.
